Queensland Health has, of 26 March, revised and updated its Public Health Directive to fall in line with other states and the Prime Ministers announcement on Tuesday night 14th March.

This new direction requires all Non-Essential business *activities* or undertakings in the state of Queensland to not operate the activity until the expiry of the direction which is 25th May 2020.

At such the committee met via skype hook up do discuss the directive in full and decided its impact and action required.

As a registered club we fall into the category of recreation not sport leaving no exceptions available to us like other categories.

It is with regret, (but with the welfare and safety of not just our own members but visitors and general public in mind) that we the committee again have to inform members of the temporary closure Porter Field and the TMAC facility until further notice.

As of 11.59 pm on 26 March when this directive comes into effect Porter Field will be closed to all members apart from maintenance crew until the expiry of the directive as mentioned previously.

Fortunately or unfortunately, we are not the only club affected as information from MAAQ and Facebook is that club closures are wide spread.

Maybe this is the time to build that new model in the box under your bed, If so don't forget to support your local hobby shop, their doing it tough too.

We will continue to keep you updated as this plays out via email and the website.

In the meantime please take care and stay safe we'll all be looking forward to seeing each other and catching up when this is over.

President's Report

TMAC General Meetings

General meetings are held on the first Wednesday of each month except January, however the Carina Leagues club has been closed indefinitely under the Queensland Government's Health directive of 23rd March.


The April General Meeting is therefore cancelled.

The Committee is examining the viability of holding the May General Meeting at Porter Field including complying with the relevant Health directives in force at that time.

The Committee will keep you informed as we progress.

Porter Field Closed due to Coronavirus

The Committee has been examining the requirements to keep Porter Field open during the Coronavirus crisis. After taking advice from the MAAQ, and other clubs in South East Queensland, along with the Queensland Chief Health Officer's directive effective from Midnight on 26th March, we have taken the decision to close Porter Field. This is especially important given the membership demographic skew (see below) where roughly half of our members are 60 or older and male, which puts those members in the high risk group.



The directive is current until 19th May, so the Committee will continue to monitor the situation and keep members informed. You are able to read the Chief Health Officer's directives on the [Queensland Health](#) site. The current directive is *Non-essential business, activity and undertaking Closure Direction (No.2)*.

Queensland Parliament inquiry into Motor Recreational Activities

On Monday 21 October 2019 the Transport and Public Works Committee resolved to inquire into and report to the Legislative Assembly on the contribution of the motor recreational activities (MRA) to Queensland, and in doing so look at the volume and range of MRAs currently practiced by and available to the people of Queensland.

Some of the Motor Recreational Activities currently enjoyed by Queenslanders are:

- Recreational flying.
- Engine powered models - including boats, aircraft, cars and now drone racing.
- Social or Marque car clubs - there are at least 183 registered car clubs in SEQ estimated to service more than 150,000 members.

- Competitive car clubs - these are venue based, known as Speedway, Drags and Circuit (including go-karting), and non-venue based, such as rallying.
- Circuit racing and historical motorcycle clubs.
- Recreational and charity ride days.
- Dirt motorcycle or motor cross clubs.

Submissions relating to Engine powered models were presented to the enquiry on the 16th March by the MAAQ, Kingaroy, and Roma clubs. The following is an excerpt of the presentation by the MAAQ President:

“The Model Aeronautical Association of Queensland is a state based association. We are part of a national association called the Model Aeronautical Association of Australia. Our members consist of around 66 clubs throughout Queensland. Two of our clubs include Roma and Kingaroy, who are in attendance via videoconference.

Across those clubs there are probably around 2,000-plus participants with an interest in aeromodelling. When I say aeromodelling, I am talking about model aircraft of all sizes, shapes and varieties including radio control—that is, controlled with a transmitter—a control line which is essentially on the end of a piece of string, free flight, indoor et cetera. It is a diverse group with diverse membership from probably five or six years of age up to people in their 90s. It is spread throughout the state.

We see quite a number of benefits through aeromodelling in terms of the social aspects. We have clubs in Queensland with 250 members. There would be a group who are there every Wednesday morning—a group of retirees—and it is a real social group. It is almost like a men’s shed with model aeroplanes. That is the best example. If you go there on a Saturday morning there will be a different group. There will be fathers and sons enjoying aeromodelling. It is a hobby that has something for everyone. My own passion is large-scale aerobatics, but other guys love the detail of scale building and things like that.

We have a number of threats. Those threats can be identified as threats to our flying facilities. We need not a huge amount of land but a certain amount of space to fly in, with overfly areas. We are quite strict on safety. We have a very strict manual of operating procedures very much focused on safety. As I said, the main threat to us is infrastructure and facilities. That is what I think this committee can highlight for us across the broader government. I am happy to speak to the benefits.

In addition to the social aspect, there is the economic activity that it generates with international events. This weekend David was in Tin Can Bay. Next weekend there are events in Dalby and Toowoomba. We have had quite large events that are supported by local councils in regional areas. A lot of our events, given the nature of the activity, are in regional areas. I think there are good economic benefits. Then the other aspect is getting kids involved in aviation at a young age in terms of the technical aspects, whether it is dealing with small internal combustion motors or electronics. There is a good story there for us to tell. I am happy to work through that during the course of today’s presentation.”

Obligations under Porter Field Area Approval

Just reminder about your obligations under the Porter Field Area Approval. Please assume that non-members may be around at any time. Just like making threats to aviation at airports, **do not make jokes about these requirements at any time:**

- **Radio Range Check.** Pilots shall successfully complete a range check as per the manufacturer's recommendation prior to the first flight of the day.
- **Fail-safe Check.** Pilots shall test the radio fail-safe function (where fitted) for correct operation prior to the first flight of the day.
- **Pre-flight Air-worthiness Check.** Pilots shall conduct a pre-flight check of aircraft prior to every flight to ensure airworthiness. All control surfaces are to be checked to ensure they are not binding and are operating correctly.
- **Height Limit.** The maximum height limit is 400ft AGL at Porter Field.

- Keeping informed is good; non-stop news is not.

4. **Take care of yourself to reduce stress and increase immunity**

- Get enough sleep, eat well and exercise if you can.

5. **Share your strength ... and your concerns**

- If you feel great, help someone out; if you do not feel great, accept help.
- Speak to someone: a friend, or a colleague.

6. **Maintain a balanced sense of achievement**

- Have a to do list for the day.
- Take a break when you have ticked something off. Don't feel guilty if you do something personal e.g. a phone call you have to make, wash the dishes etc.
- When you have finished it all, prepare the plan for tomorrow and then stop.

And please, please, please if you or your family has concerns or need help, reach out.

Reporting Crashes outside Porter Field Boundary

Finally a reminder that you must provide a written report to the Secretary if you crash an aircraft outside the Porter Field boundary, if anyone is injured, or if property is damaged. Remember, never admit liability; leave it to our insurers.

Providing a report is not a reflection on the pilot, but provides a record in case the club is served with a claim against the MAAA insurance policy.

Secretary's Report

Happy Easter to everyone!

Lease renewal:

As at time of writing we have had no further news from Brisbane City Council regarding our lease renewal. Not to worry though as I'm told that it will happen, just in BCC time and this is normal.

By-laws update:

Our March meeting signaled voting time on the proposed updated By-Laws 16 "Code of Conduct" & 19 "Operations during a Total Fire Ban or declared fire emergency".

Both By-Laws resulted in a unanimous vote of acceptance on the night.

Containers for change:

Thanks to the efforts of Pat and Lynne Wilson our club is now registered with Containers for Change. As well as recycling soft drink cans from the canteen, members can also donate cash to the club through recycling as well.

B.C.C Maintenance works:

For those members who were not aware, Brisbane City Council has been conducting a works program around our buildings for free. This has been completed and we can now enjoy the benefits of new stairs leading up to the viewing area above the bunker and canteen, freshly painted fencing, railings at stairs into the pits and steel structures.

Grants:

Work on the new Disabled Parking bay areas at the western and eastern end of the car park has now been completed and signed off thanks to the Brisbane City Council grant and Will Sipma his crew of helpers. There could still be some small items to be completed (one never knows what Will has on his mind) but by far the major works are now in place and usable.

Heli v Fixed wing on main runway:

This seems to raise its head on average once a year, so I'll clarify for any new members.

The main runway is there for the use of both fixed wing and rotary wing aircraft at all times. It is a shared zone during operational hours and operates the same way continuously in that all aircraft must fly in a circuit and in the same direction, unless pilot to pilot communications can mutually agree upon an alternate circuit or other course of action i.e. one does aerobatics in the middle of the field while the other does circuits around the outside. Communications is the key!

Solar system repairs:

Over the past few weeks we have been having trouble with one of the inverters linked to the solar panels on the roof of the viewing deck. This has been causing loss of power in the canteen. Expert advice has been sort on the matter and the result is we will need to replace the faulty unit.

Fortunately, with the Covid19 closure, impact will be minimal, however depending on talks with BCC we may be looking to issue a notice of motion for funds to replace the unit between now and when we can open our doors again. We will keep you posted as we know more.

Finally,

All of your committee try very hard to keep improvements happening and be up to date and on top of unfolding events and regulations affecting us. The last 6 months have seen unprecedented times in the latter not seen in our generation. First the effects of fires killing many of our country men and women and now a virus proving just as deadly if not more potentially if complacency takes over.
